



# A Blast from the Past







Tells the story of a young African-American man sentenced to death for a murder he did not commit, and a teacher who tries to impart to him his learning and pride before the execution.



Eight-year-old "Scout" Finch tells of life in a small Alabama town where her father is a lawyer.





Remarque, Erich Maria, 1898-1970. All quiet on the Western front. Boston, : Little, Brown, [1958, c1930].


Depicts the experiences of a group of young German soldiers fighting and suffering during the last days of World War I.

Swanson, James L. Chasing Lincoln's killer. New York : Scholastic Press, c2009.



Walker, Sally M. Written in bone : buried lives of Jamestown and Colonial Maryland. Minneapolis, MN : Carolrhoda Books, c2009.


