






Read, Piers Paul, 1941-. Alive. New York : Avon, [1975], c1974.


Discusses the ordeal of the survivors of an airplane crash in 1972 in the Andes wilderness.

Warren, Robert Penn, 1905-1989. All the king's men. Orlando : Harcourt, [2006?], c1946.


Willie Stark, a well-intentioned idealistic back-country lawyer, is unable to resist greed for power and lust for politics during his rise and fall as an American demagogue.







Rumford, James, 1948-. Beowulf : a hero's tale retold. Boston, Mass. : Houghton Mifflin, 2007.




Having fallen for a human boy, a beautiful teenage werewolf must battle both her packmates and the fear of the townspeople to decide where she belongs and with whom.




A high school freshman discovers the devastating consequences of refusing to join in the school's annual fund raising drive and arousing the wrath of the school bullies.



DeFilippis, Nunzio. The curious case of Benjamin Button : a graphic novel. Philadelphia : Quirk Books, c2008.





Presents an examination of the fast food industry, tracing its history and discussing how it arose in postwar America, as well as the impact it has had on economy, food production, and popular culture.




Presents an account of the Marines who came together during the battle of Iwo Jima to raise the American flag in a moment that has been immortalized in one of the most famous photographs of World War II.


A novel describing the experiences of four children who are locked up in the attic of their grandmother's home after the death of their father.



Set in the near future, America has become a puritanical theocracy and Offred tells her story as a Handmaid under the new social order whose function is to breed.




Seconds before Earth is demolished to make room for a galactic freeway, an earthman is saved by his friend. Together they journey through the galaxy.


Roy, who is new to his small Florida community, becomes involved in another boy's attempt to save a colony of burrowing owls from a proposed construction site.

New York City teenager Craig Gilner succumbs to academic and social pressures at an elite high school and enters a psychiatric hospital after attempting suicide.





Golden, Arthur, 1957-. Memoirs of a geisha : a novel. Large print ed. New York : Random House Large Print, [2005], c1997.


