
Calame, Don. Swim the fly. 1st ed. Somerville, Mass. : Candlewick Press, 2009.



Awkward freshman Will Carter endures many painful moments during his first year of high school before realizing that nothing good comes easily, focus is everything, and the payoff is usually incredible.







F Goldman



Halpern, Julie, 1975-. Into the wild nerd yonder. 1st ed. New York : Feiwel and Friends, 2009.



Jinks, Catherine. The reformed vampire support group. Boston : Harcourt, 2009.



Korman, Gordon. Born to rock. 1st Hyperion Paperbacks ed. New York : Hyperion Paperbacks, 2008, c2006.


High school senior Leo Caraway, a conservative Republican, learns that his biological father is a punk rock legend.





Lubar, David. Sleeping freshmen never lie. New York : Speak, 2007, c2005.


While navigating his first year of high school and awaiting the birth of his new baby brother, Scott loses old friends and gains some unlikely new ones as he hones his skills as a writer.
