




Seconds before Earth is demolished to make room for a galactic freeway, an earthman is saved by his friend. Together they journey through the galaxy.


The story of how Vahan Kenderian survived the Turkish massacre of the Armenians in 1915.






A bookburner official in a future fascist state finds out books are a vital part of a culture he never knew. He clandestinely pursues reading, until he is betrayed.


Ender, who is the result of genetic experimentation, may be the military genius Earth needs in its war against an alien enemy.

Huxley, Aldous, 1894-1963. Brave new world ; : and Brave new world revisited. 1st ed. New York : HarperCollins, [2004].



Kamara, Mariatu. The bite of the mango. Buffalo, NY : Annick Press, c2008.



A boy grows to manhood while attempting to subdue the evil he unleashed on the world as an apprentice to the Master Wizard.





A novel in vignettes, in which Lakshmi, a thirteen-year-old girl from Nepal, is sold into prostitution in India.



Reeve, Philip. Here lies Arthur. 1st American ed. New York : Scholastic Press, 2008, c2007.






